The Barts Health group of hospitals provides specialist and acute health services that treat almost one million individual patients every year. Around 2.5 million people living in east London, an area characterised by significant diversity and health inequalities, look to our services to provide them with the healthcare they need

We are among the biggest providers in the NHS and account for 1.5 per cent of hospital activity in England. Our vision is to be a high-performing group of NHS hospitals, renowned for excellence and innovation, and providing safe and compassionate care to our patients in east London and beyond.

The Royal London in Whitechapel is a major teaching hospital providing local and specialist services in state-of-the-art facilities. Whipps Cross in Leytonstone is a busy general hospital with a range of local services. Newham in Plaistow is also a busy general hospital with innovative facilities such as its orthopaedic centre. Mile End Hospital is a shared facility in Mile End at which we provide rehabilitation, outpatient, x-ray and community services. And St Bartholomew's in the City, London's oldest hospital, is a regional and national centre of excellence for cardiac and cancer care.

As well as district general hospital facilities for three London boroughs (Tower Hamlets, Waltham Forest and Newham), we have the largest cardiovascular centre in the UK, the second largest cancer centre in London, an internationally-renowned trauma team, and the home of the London Air Ambulance. The Royal London also houses one of the largest children's hospitals in the UK, a major dental hospital, and leading stroke and renal units.

Barts Health is also part of the UCLPartners academic health science partnership. The objective of UCLPartners is to translate cutting edge research and innovation into measurable health gain for patients and populations through partnership across settings and sectors, and through excellence in education.

The Royal London Hospital is located approximately 1 mile from the "City of London", in the London Borough of Tower Hamlets. The hospital provides a wide range of services and treatments and services to all age groups across the population. It is 1 of 5 locations within the Trusts Group model, which provide acute services and this includes a full range of medical services: acute medicine, cardiology, endocrinology, gastroenterology, respiratory, clinical immunology, infectious diseases, sexual health medicine, women's health, dermatology, audiology, older people's medicine, neurology, stroke medicine, and rheumatology. The Emergency Department deals with attendance of all types, including those patients who are referred by their GP or who self-present, or are brought in by the London Ambulance service. There are a range of specialist services provided, such as the designation of the RLH as a Level One Trauma Centre, Hyper-Acute-Stroke unit, Neurosurgical centre, Renal Transplant centre, alongside a newly expanded "Covid-19" response critical care centre (176 bedded), pain management, haematology and rheumatology (as networked centres for the group). The site also provides care for patients requiring treatment for substance misuse such as detoxification.

The hospital has networked renal satellite units located at the Newham University Hospitals Dialysis Unit, Whipps Cross Hospital in Leytonstone, Queens Hospital in Romford, St Georges Hospital and St Bartholomew's Hospital. Sexual health satellite units are located and run from Newham University Hospitals, Mile End Hospital and the Sir Ludwig Guttmann Wellbeing and Medical Centre in Stratford. Urgent Care Services provided by the organisation "GP Care Group" are provided from this location.

The site also provides surgical services including colorectal, hepato-biliary, vascular, oral and maxillofacial, endocrine, plastic, neuroscience, ear, nose and throat, trauma, orthopaedic, urology, renal transplant, dental and orthodontic surgery for both adults and children. In addition, the RLH's co-located dental hospital service provides networked care at Southend Health and Dental Care Centre, the Barkantine Centre and the Sir Ludwig Guttmann Centre Wellbeing and Medical Centre.

The RLH is 1 of 3 hospitals at Barts Health NHS Trust, which provide in-patient paediatric and neonatal services providing care to babies and children and young people, which includes outpatient, community services and the provision of nursing input for the boroughs special education needs schools. In excess of 100,000 attendances to the emergency department are babies and CYP. Children's outpatient services provide paediatric and specialty clinics for neurology, renal, diabetes, urology, infectious diseases, genetics and dietetics. They also facilitate paediatric procedures including echocardiograms, prolonged jaundice screening, phlebotomy and pre-operative assessments. All community services are specifically registered to Trust Headquarters located in Whitechapel. Children requiring section 47 Medical Reviews may be referred by Children's Social Care.

A full range of diagnostics and screening services are provided by the Royal London and Mile End Hospital including, but not limited to radiology, interventional radiology, nuclear medicine, ultrasound and magnetic resonance imaging. In addition, pathology services are provided on site across its laboratories (networked service for the group). The Royal London Hospital also supplies blood and blood products to other organisations, and supplies blood for use by the co-located / contracted charity, "The London Air Ambulance service" and the "London Neonatal Transport Service" allowing urgent roadside transfusions to take place across the region. As described, the site also hosts, via a joint contract, the London Air Ambulance Headquarters / Helicopter Base and the regional neonatal transport service.

The Royal London Hospital also providers maternity and midwifery services that consist of antenatal clinics with ultrasound scanning and a day assessment unit. Consultant obstetrician led care is provided for women with high risk pregnancies, whilst community midwives based at this location manage the care of women deemed to be low risk. Intrapartum care for all deliveries is provided by midwives based in the maternity unit. The maternity unit has close links with the paediatric service for

the provision of neonatal care and the anaesthetic team for the provision of pain relief and management of women with serious pregnancy complications. The service also comprises a networked freestanding midwifery-led unit from the Barkantine Birth Centre. There is a dedicated team who support new mothers with breastfeeding in hospital and the community.

At the Royal London Hospital we also provide a family planning service, including termination of pregnancies and fitting of intra-uterine coil devices (IUCD) for menstrual disorders and post termination of pregnancy.

St Bartholomew's Hospital is proud to be the oldest hospital in Britain still occupying its original site. Healthcare has been provided free at the hospital since 1123 when it was founded by Rahere, a member of the court of King Henry I. In 2023 the hospital will celebrate its 900th birthday.

St Bartholomew's Hospital is an internationally renowned teaching hospital located in the City of London, close to St Paul's cathedral. The hospital is a centre of excellence for both cardiac and cancer care and offers a range of innovative services including robotic surgery, complex electrophysiology, stem cell transplantation and immunotherapy.

Barts Heart Centre, based in the hospital's state-of-the-art King George V (KGV) building, is Europe's largest specialised cardiovascular centre, covering a population of around six million people. With state-of-the-art facilities including 10 theatres, 10 cath labs and more than 300 general, cardiac and critical care beds, the Heart Centre aspires to perform more heart surgery, MRI and CT scans than any other service in the world.

Home to the National Cardiac Audit Programme, Barts Heart Centre is part of the wider cardiovascular services delivered by Barts Health and works with hospitals in the area to provide comprehensive care for patients, ensuring that the majority of care is provided as close to home as possible. A number of outreach programmes promoting heart health are also run in the community, including visits to local schools across north east London.

The Barts Heart Centre forms part of the UCLPartners Academic Health Science Network, facilitating research, development and collaboration across a wide group of healthcare providers and academic institutions.

A specialist heart attack centre at the hospital delivers dedicated emergency care 24 hours a day, seven days a week with rapid access to a team with the specialist expertise and equipment required to treat someone who has had a heart attack. Ambulance crews are trained to recognise the signs of a heart attack and to bring the patient directly to the centre instead of an emergency department. In January 2020 the service was rated number one for cardiac arrest survival rates in London.

Barts Cancer Centre also has an international reputation for treating both common and rare cancers. The Centre, which is the second biggest of its kind in London, provides cancer services to more than 1.5 million people from across east London, the south and east of England and is also a tertiary referral centre for some specialist national services.

Around 2,000 patients are receiving treatment at the Centre at any one time, with 350 new patients starting treatment each month. The majority of its services are provided at St Bartholomew's Hospital. It also offers cancer services at The Royal London, Newham and Whipps Cross hospitals. In 2020, the Centre was found to have the best surgical resection rates for lung cancer in the country.

As well as offering the latest minimally invasive surgical procedures, cancer drugs, stem cell and gene therapies, Barts Cancer Centre has an impressive array of cutting-edge imaging, radiotherapy and radio surgery technology. It is a Cancer Research UK Centre of Excellence and National Institute for Health Research Cardiovascular Biomedical Research Centre.

The hospital has a spacious layout designed around the needs of patients and staff. Forty per cent of the beds are large en-suite single rooms; the remainder are spacious two and four bedded bays. The environment is designed to reduce noise and the temperature is controlled by ventilated fresh air that is specially treated before it enters the building to reduce the risk of airborne infection. The hospital has a number of additional services on site, including specialised endocrinology and fertility services, as well as traditional hospital outpatient services.

Whipps Cross Hospital is a cherished part of the local community it serves, and has been for over 100 years. The hospital has been serving people of Waltham Forest, Redbridge and beyond long before the NHS was created, and its Victorian buildings and long corridor are distinctive parts of the local landscape. It is one of the biggest local employers, and every day almost 1,800 patients pass through its doors – as well as numerous relatives, friends and other visitors. Whipps Cross provides a full range of general inpatient, outpatient and day case services, as well as maternity services and a 24-hour Emergency Department and Urgent Care Centre. The hospital has a strong reputation as a centre of excellence for various specialist services, including urology, ENT, audiology, cardiology, colorectal surgery, cancer care and acute stroke care.

The Emergency Department receives walk in and Ambulance patients with acute medical emergencies. The department is a 24 hour Trauma Unit. The type 1 services comprises of a resus room, majors, paediatric emergency department and a minors area. The department has a 24 hour co-located urgent care centre which is run by the North East London Foundation Trust (NELFT). The Urgent care Centre is GP and Nurse practitioner lead to care for streamed type 3 patient.

Acute Medical Care provision is provided by a dedicated acute physician team including acute geriatricians, delivering medical care via Acute Assessment Unit (AAU). The Acute medical referrals are supported by a Frail Elderly Unit (FAU) with a dedicated team and also runs an Ambulatory Emergency Care (AEC) in hours and weekends. Specialty Medicine inpatient care is delivered by specialty teams such as Respiratory, Gastroenterology, Diabetes and Endocrine and Cardiology, as well as Rheumatology and Neurology providing inpatient care. Speciality Medicine services also provide outpatient care, predominately in the main Outpatient Department, Chest Clinic and Gillian Hanson Centre. The Endoscopy Unit also provides day case endoscopy procedures. Elderly Care is delivered by Dedicated team of Geriatricians. The site also has a dedicated Acute Stroke Unit. An Ortho-geriatrician also supports orthopaedic wards. Elderly patients, if required post discharge, are followed up by multi-disciplinary team at the Connaught Day Hospital for on-going assessment and treatment.

The Division of Surgery at Whipps Cross consists of General Surgery, Colorectal, Upper GI, Vascular, both elective and Trauma Orthopaedics, Urology, Ophthalmology and ENT surgery. We also provide Paediatric services in a range of specialities.

We provide 24 hour emergency cover that is networked to other hospitals part of Barts Health NHS Trust. We have a full range of outpatient facilities supporting all services, including treatment rooms for diagnostic and minor procedures. There is a pre-operative assessment unit that all elective inpatients visit prior to surgery. There is also a dedicated admission area for elective in-patients and a surgery unit.

The hospital also offers Critical Care services along with a High Dependency Unit. There is 24/7

medical cover on the unit. The Critical Care outreach team (CCOT) joined the wider critical care team in 2019 and the development of this team continues to go from strength to strength. The team is an active member of the trust and North East North London Critical care network.

The maternity department at Whipps Cross University Hospital is one of the busiest in the region There is currently a programme of building work underway to modernise the maternity unit and create an alongside women's centre where women with the full spectrum of obstetric and gynaecological issues can be seen in specialist clinics. There are a variety of specialist antenatal clinics within the department. These include a maternal medicine clinic, an endocrine clinic, a perinatal mental health clinic, a pre-term birth clinic and a breech clinic. Other services include: outpatient hysteroscopy service, general/specialist gynaecology clinics, subspecialist uro-gynaecology, endometriosis service, subfertility clinic, onsite and community based Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) clinic, in partnership with NEL external partners (highly commended in the BMJ and HSJ Awards 2019).

Whipps Cross is going through a massive re-development programme. A brand new hospital will deliver the same core services as today, including A&E and maternity, to serve a growing population. It will also allow the opportunity to deliver new integrated care models in line with the NHS long-term plan, including the potential to establish Whipps Cross as a centre of expertise for the care of frail and older patients. The vision for the redevelopment of Whipps Cross has been developed with and is shared by both health system and local government partners and endorsed by Government as one of the six trusts to be named in phase 1 of the national Health Infrastructure Plan (HIP).

Developing the near-18 hectare Whipps Cross site would see a new hospital within a redeveloped site setting alongside new homes and other facilities, including the opportunity for the co-location of other health and care services, benefiting the community and promoting wider economic regeneration. A new hospital will also transform the experience for staff, helping to attract and retain our workforce. More patients will be able to be seen and treated on the same day with faster access to senior clinicians and double the number of diagnostic tests. This will help avoid unnecessary stays in hospital.

Newham University is located close to Stratford, in the London Borough of Newham. The hospital provides a wide range of services and treatments and services to all age groups across the population. It is 1 of 5 locations within the Trusts Group model, which provide acute services and this includes a full range of medical services including acute medicine, cardiology, endocrinology, gastroenterology, respiratory, women's health, older people's medicine, and stroke medicine. The Emergency Department and Urgent Treatment Centre deal with attendance of all types, including those patients who are referred by their GP or who self-present, or are brought in by the London Ambulance service.

The hospital has one of the networked renal satellite units located at the Newham University Hospitals Dialysis Unit within the adjacent Gateway Surgical Centre.

The site also provides general surgical services within Newham University Hospital, and elective orthopaedic care for the Trust in the Gateway Surgical Centre.

Newham University Hospital is one of the three hospitals within Barts Health NHS Trust that provide in-patient paediatric and neonatal services providing care to babies and children and young people, including outpatient services, which provide paediatric and specialty clinics. They also facilitate paediatric procedures including prolonged jaundice screening and phlebotomy. All community services are specifically registered to Trust Headquarters located in Whitechapel. Children requiring section 47 Medical Reviews may be referred by Children's Social Care.

A full range of diagnostics and screening services are provided by Newham University Hospital, including but not limited to radiology, nuclear medicine, ultrasound and magnetic resonance imaging. In addition, pathology services are provided on site in a single laboratory.

Newham University Hospital provides maternity services that consist of antenatal clinics with ultrasound scanning and a day assessment unit. Consultant obstetrician led care is provided for women with high risk pregnancies, whilst community midwives based at this location manage the care of women deemed to be low risk. Intrapartum care for all deliveries is provided by midwives based in the maternity unit. The maternity unit has close links with the paediatric service for the provision of neonatal care and the anaesthetic team for the provision of pain relief and management of women with serious pregnancy complications. The service also comprises a networked freestanding midwifery-led unit from the Barking Birth Centre. There is a dedicated team who support new mothers with breastfeeding in hospital and the community.

Newham University Hospital provides a limited family planning service, including termination of pregnancies, management of menstrual disorders and post termination of pregnancy.

The Sir Ludwig Guttmann Health and Wellbeing Centre, is located in Stratford within the borough of Newham. It is fully accessible and has good transport links within the North East London (NEL) boroughs and those who may be present within the local area. The location provides mixed academic and secondary care dental clinics, paediatric dentistry (management and treatment of children that require restorations, extractions and abnormal oral conditions) networked to the RLH's Dental Hospital.

Sexual health services are also provided to local residents, managed and networked to the RLH.
