# Your Morning Surgical Procedure at Newham Hospital

# Date and Time of Arrival

- Your procedure will be on Friday \_
- Please arrive at 7.00am (your procedure can occur any time up until 12.30pm)

# **Location for Procedure**

 Forest Ward (Junction 10, First Floor) Newham University Hospital Glen Road London E13 8RU

# How to get there

- Travel by Bus 262 or 473
- London Underground Plaistow (District Line or Hammersmith and City)
- Forest Ward is at junction 10, first floor of Newham University Hospital. The closest entrance is the west entrance (same side as Emergency Department).

# Childcare

• Please arrange for childcare on the day of the procedure as children are not allowed to wait in the waiting area or clinical area.





# **Escort**

- You will need an adult escort to accompany you home following your procedure.
- Escorts are allowed to wait in the waiting room for Forest Ward but are not allowed into any clinical areas.
- The exception to this is if you are aged under 18, then an adult can remain with you in Forest Ward only.

# Food and drink prior to your procedure

- Your procedure will be under general anaesthetic.
- Please do not eat any food after 1.00am on the day of your procedure. You can have small sips of water only until 6.00am.
- Please avoid smoking for 24 hours before your surgery.

# What to bring

- Comfortable clothes.
- Your usual medications in original packaging
- Sanitary pads.
- **Do not** bring valuables or large sums of money to the procedure.

#### Make up and Jewellery

- Remove all nail varnish, make up, jewellery and piercings prior to your procedure.
- Shower before your procedure.

#### **Procedure**

- You will meet your surgeon and anaesthetist before your procedure once admitted onto Forest Ward
- You will be given medication before the procedure to prepare the cervix (neck of the womb) for the surgery.
- Your procedure will be under general anaesthetic (you will not be awake, will not feel pain and will not remember the procedure). This is carried out in the anaesthetic room.
- Your surgery will take 15 minutes and is carried out in the operating theatre after your general anaesthetic.
- You can be started on any **contraceptive** method either at the procedure or shortly afterwards discuss these with your doctor if you have questions.
- After your surgery, you will spend some time in the recovery area coming round from your anaesthesia and then will be transferred back to Forest Ward.
- You can be discharged from Forest Ward once fully recovered and your escort can take you home.



# **Side Effects**

- Nausea and vomiting can occur due to the pre-medications we give. We can give anti-sickness medication if this occurs.
- Bleeding, which can last for up to 2 weeks.
- Crampy period pain which should be manageable with simple pain relief (paracetamol and ibuprofen).
- Drowsiness after general anaesthetic which should resolve within 24 hours.

#### **Post Procedure**

- Avoid alcohol and smoking for 24 hours.
- Do not drive, operate heavy machinery, or look after children on your own for 24 hours.
- Avoid using tampons and penetrative sex until after your next period.

#### In Case of Emergency

Go to your local Accident & Emergency if you have any of the following symptoms:

Heavy vaginal bleeding High temperature Redness in leg Shortness of breath Smelly vaginal discharge Feeling chills or shivery Pain in your leg Chest pain
